Guest Keynote Speakers

Professor Tom Craig

Tom Craig has been involved in the set up and running of the South London and Maudsley (SLaM) Psychosis CAG. He is also the Professor of Community and Social Psychiatry at the Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology & Neuroscience, King's College London and is jointly leading The Collaboration for Leadership in Applied Health Research and Care (CLAHRC) South London research that aims to improve the physical health of people who have experienced psychosis. He also works as a Consultant Psychiatrist in community-based services for young people experiencing symptoms of psychosis.

Doctor Fiona Gaughran

Fiona Gaughran is the psychosis CAG lead for physical health. She is also Lead Consultant in the Psychosis Service at SLaM and holds an Honorary Senior Lecturer position at the Institute of Psychiatry. As part of her role, Dr. Gaughran is responsible for implementing new, evidence-based approaches relating to people with psychotic illnesses that have been resistant to treatment.
